Action Plan Launch:

- After two years of planning (community needs assessment followed by development of new three-year action plan), the Action Plan 2024-2026 officially launched in January.
- Team reviewed the new action plan, including potential action items we might undertake in each domain.
- Following review, team engaged in an online interactive activity to gauge where people's interest and energies lie as we determine how to implement the new action plan. (ATTACHED: Slides showing this activity)
- Steering Committee will be reaching out to follow up on involvement prior to the next LT meeting in May.

Notable discussion:

- Interest in **employment efforts for older adults** people want or need to work in older age but face ageism (internalized and external) and racism. Some good connections were made between members who will continue conversation outside the meeting.
- Questions and discussion about resources/information for families preparing for the death of a loved one. Where to find information about legal, financial and other steps to take?
- Information sought about how support animals are and/or can be made welcome in more places in the community

TEAM UPDATES

Carrie M/North Memorial:

- Hospital has new CEO; it's been a good transition so far.
- Hospital foundation will fund a second trauma symposium for this fall.
- North Memorial is prioritizing breast health for Black women and plans to become a center of excellence in this area to address great disparities.
- MG Hospital campus will be expanding. More to come, but there may be opportunity for AF MG to engage in this process.
